



1. General Conditions

- a) The Swim England Swimming Leadership Group (“the Group”) reserves full powers over the National Winter Championships (25m), including but not limited to cancelling, postponing or changing the Championships venue and/or format due to reasons beyond its reasonable control.
- b) The Championships shall be held under Swim England Regulations and Technical Rules of Swimming.
- c) Entries may only be accepted from competitors registered as members of Swim England, Scottish Swimming or Swim Wales (‘British Competitors’) or competitors from one of the countries affiliated to World Aquatics (WA) (‘Overseas Competitors’). British Competitors and Overseas Competitors shall be collectively referred to as ‘Competitors’. Where required to do so, competitors shall present their passport for age verification to the National Event Officer, or other authorised person, not later than 15:00 hours on the day before the Championships begin.
- d) A British Competitor must be a registered member of the club in whose name the entry is being made, at the date of making the initial entry. This club must be offered by the online entry system. Competitors may enter in the name of one club only. Competitors who are members of British Clubs must enter via their British Club.
- e) Ages at midnight on the 31 December 2023.

2. The Events

- a) Individual events:
50m, 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m and 1500m Freestyle
50m, 100m & 200m Backstroke, Breaststroke, Butterfly
100, 200m & 400m Individual Medley

3. Entries

- a) Entries shall be received no later than the ‘closing date’ i.e. 12 noon on Wednesday 22 November 2023, accompanied by the appropriate entry fee. (Individual £13.50 per entered event).
- b) All entrants must have equaled or bettered the qualifying times. All individual times from Swim England, Scottish Swimming and Swim Wales entrants must be recorded in the British Rankings from Swimming Competitions designated or licensed at Levels 1 or 2 since 1 October 2022.
- c) The fastest time recorded in British Rankings will be accepted for entry (Level 1 Long course or Level 2 Short course – whichever is quicker). Times will not be converted.
- d) The Female category is for birth sex females in accordance with Swim England’s Transgender and Non-Binary Competition Policy. By entering the ‘Female’ category, a swimmer confirms that their birth sex is female.
- e) Overseas Competitors must submit entry times that are recorded in the WA Rankings or in official meet results from a National Governing Body sanctioned competition and be achieved since 1 October 2022.
- f) The Group Competition Lead has the authority to adjust the number of entries accepted to ensure the smooth running of the Championships.



4. Administration

- a) Coaches, team managers and chaperones will be required to obtain a poolside accreditation pass by means of an online application in advance of the closing date. Coaches, team managers and chaperones must print their own pass.
- b) Competitors must print their own accreditation. A link will be provided in the email sent to them confirming acceptance of their entry. Overseas Competitors will be required to supply a suitable photograph.
- c) Admission to the pool and athlete only areas will only be allowed with a valid accreditation.
- d) Should a competitor withdraw from all events they have entered then their accreditation will become invalid and entry to the athlete areas will not be permitted.
- e) A charge will be levied for lost, mislaid or forgotten passes.

5. Meet Procedure

- a) All individual events shall have heats and Open, 18 & over (Senior) & 17 & under (Youth) Finals, with the exception of the 800m & 1500m which shall be Heat Declared Winner events.
- b) The fastest ten Competitors from the heats, irrespective of age, shall be allocated places in the Open Final.
- c) The next fastest ten Competitors, aged 18 and older will be allocated places in the Senior Final. The next fastest ten Competitors aged 17 or younger, shall be allocated places in the Youth Final. There will be two reserves declared for all Finals.
- d) A competitor in the Senior or Youth Finals may also be a reserve for the Open Final and will be moved to the Open Final as necessary.
- e) Only two Overseas Competitors may progress to the Open Final.
- f) There is no restriction on the Number of Overseas Competitors who may progress to the Senior or Youth Finals.
- g) Competitors whose entries have been accepted will be expected to swim unless they have complied with the withdrawal procedure.

6. Withdrawal from Heats

- a) Withdrawals must be made by the end of the Team Leader Meeting for day 1 swims and by 12 noon on the day before for all subsequent days.
- b) An online Withdrawal process will be used. There will be no paper withdrawal forms.

7. Withdrawal from Finals

- a) Finalists, not wishing to swim, shall notify the Chief Recorder of their intention to withdraw no later than 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last individual event in the Heat Sessions. The Sessions with 800m & 1500m events will be classed as a different session. The withdrawal shall be made via the official online process. There will be no paper withdrawal forms.
- b) Reserves will be released 30 minutes after this time.



8. Call Room

- a) Competitors must report to the competition stewards in the Call Room for heats and finals and follow their direction. It is Competitors' responsibility to report in good time for their event.
- b) Finalists are required to report to the Call Room in sufficient time and be available to parade for their event. They must enter the Call Room 'race ready' as under normal circumstances having entered the Call Room they should remain in its confines until lead onto the pool deck for their race. Upon entry, Competitors must ensure that they report to a Steward and be registered as being present in the Call Room.
- c) Coaches, team managers and chaperones will not be allowed in the Call Room area during the finals at any time.

9. Medals

- a) Medals shall be awarded to the first, second and third placed British Competitors in each Open Final.
- b) Commemorative Medals will be awarded to Overseas Competitors placed first, second or third in the Open Final.

10. Doping Control

- a) Competitors taking part in the Championships may be subject to random doping control sample collection.
- b) Competitors are required to bring and have with them at all times either a passport or other form of identity incorporating their photograph. Competitor accreditation will be acceptable.

11. Team Leader Meeting

- a) It is a requirement for a representative from all clubs with Competitors entered in this Championships to attend the Team Leader Meeting, which will take place on the evening of 13 December 2023. The time and location will be notified in the Competitor Confirmation Pack.

Para Specific Conditions

12. Para Swimming

- a) The general conditions for the Championships shall apply to the Para-Swimming events except where varied by any of the following conditions.
- b) The Events:

13. Eligibility

- a) All

competitors must have an authorised World Para Swimming Classification, British Swimming Classification, INAS-FID or British Blind Sport Classification, which is held on the British Swimming Database at the time of entry.

- b) Minimum Age is 11 years at 31 December 2023.
- c) Entries will only be accepted from Competitors who have a swim recorded in British Para Rankings with a British Para Points score of at least 350 points.
- d) All Para events will be competed as Mixed Classification Events.
- e) Finalists (10) shall be determined by the British Para-Swimming Point (BPS) scores from the heats according to the competitors classification, the stroke and the distance
- f) There will be heats and a final for each event except where there are less than 10 entrants for an event. In this instance the event will be swum as a Heat Declared Winner Event in the Heats Session.
- g) In the event of a dead heat of equal points which results in the number of finalists exceeding ten the swimmer with the fastest time will be allocated a place in the final. If the competitors have the same time a swim-off shall take place to determine which of those swimmers shall go forward to the final.
- h) Finals will be seeded by time.
- i) The competition shall take place under the relevant WPS Swimming Rules and Regulations.

14 Accreditation

- a) All personal care attendants must have accreditation. Personal care attendants will only be permitted for swimmers where assistance is permitted on their code of exceptions. Such attendants will be excluded from any restrictions and will be given the same accreditation as the swimmer for whom they have personal care responsibilities.
- b) A competitor who has assistance as specified above may have both a coach and a personal care attendant present. The personal care attendant accreditation will be free of charge.

15. Medals

- a) Medals shall be awarded on a multi-class basis to the competitor placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each event by using BPS scores for each event.
- b) If there are less than four swimmers in any event then a minus one ruling shall apply. If there is only one competitor in an event than a medal shall be awarded if they break the British Record for their classification.
- c) Medals shall be awarded during the relevant session that the event has taken place.
